Public comment was received from the following individuals regarding action items on tonight's agenda:

- 1. Lynn Riddle Retired Federal Judge, shared her analysis and investigative research of the difference between the NMUSD and OCDE resolutions taking opposite positions on charter school act reform. The NMUSD resolution supports reform of the CA Charter Schools Act to keep the approval and oversight of charter schools with the district in which the charter will be established. The OCDE resolution takes the opposite position of no reform needed allowing the petitioner the right of appeal to a 'neutral party' (OCDE Board) should a district deny a charter. During her research she discovered the following facts typical County Boards of Education spend \$25,000 on their election campaigns; the OCDE Board has overturned all 12 of the charter school denials brought to them in the past four years; the vote on the NMUSD charter denial was 3/2 to overturn the NMUSD denial of the ISSAC charter; of the three board members who voted to overturn the NMUSD denial, two were elected in 2018 and they spent approximately \$800,000 on their campaigns with \$425,000 received from the CA Charter Schools PACS and the third member was elected in 2016 and received 63% of his campaign funding from the CA Charter Schools Association.
- 2. Laurie Smith shared support of Resolution 22-04-19 supporting reform to the CA Charter Schools Act
- 3. Britt Dowdy shared support of reform to the CA Charter School Act
